Business Arising from Minutes	 The donated fair pass has been delivered to St. Andrew's School. The timer for the exterior lights has been adjusted. 		
Correspondence	 Rod Sutherland presented the board with information regarding the UV water treatment system, which will be needing updated in the future due to a faulty sensor from an electrical surge during the recent storm. There is no safety concern at the moment, however the faulty sensor mandates an update to ensure the system meets the code under the Health Unit. A new system would cost \$3,845+HST, installed, with an expected 20 years until replacement. Communication is occurring with insurance regarding the issue. The \$2,000 grant from the County of Dufferin has been received, and another grant in the amount of \$300 was approved by the Township of Amaranth. The OMAFRA grant is still in waiting. The town of Mono has issued a partnership value for the use of their water truck, based on last year's usage, at \$5,600. Letters have been sent out looking for more sponsors for the Ag. Ed. days to the Soils and Crops group, as well as the Christian Farmers. Treasurer's Report	 The hydro spreadsheet was presented by Kim Lawson, showing that facility hydro has substantially increased over the past few years. The possibility of stray voltage will be investigated. The Kitchen audit was presented, showing utility usage and rental returns. The OAS has been approached with the opportunity to put in an ATM which will not cost anything, however the OAS will receive a set dollar amount beyond a certain threshold. The Lions Club Homeshow was a success, they will reach the end of their contract regarding a ban on a price increase, following next year's show. Manager's Report	 It was suggested that the OAS could potentially charge for parking to recuperate costs for repairs to the parking lot. This has many issues which would require further discussion, including that the OAS must be fair to all clients, liability and expectations, ability to provide adequate parking in poor weather conditions, money collection, and client appreciation. Financials – the Fair Coordinator salary has been moved to payroll expenses. To apply for the Celebrate Ontario grant, money needs to be allocated to event research, therefore the budget has been adjusted accordingly. The OAS has been approached by their current equipment supplier with the opportunity to purchase a Land Pride gang mower. This is not in the budget at the moment, discussion will be temporarily deferred. The Erin Agricultural Society has requested the use of the OAS bleachers the weekend following the Orangeville Fair. There would need to be a nominal charge along with a partnership. The parking lot lights were noticed to be off at times during the Home Show. The breakers will be inspected. The summer student interview team will consist of Donna Henderson, Jen Arnold, and Lucas Grit. Whether the OAS will receive funding for one or two summer students is still in waiting. Upcoming events were discussed. Screenings will arrive to fix the barn following the Area 3 Quarter Horse show.
