Rules:

1. Age **MUST** be clearly printed on the front of the entry tag. Enter only in the child's own age group or older. Exhibitor tags must be firmly attached to work
2. Youth fair exhibitors must have their own exhibitor number. No exhibitor fee will be charged for this class. An exhibitor fee of \$5 will be charged if exhibitor wishes to show in open (adult) classes.
3. Read the rules carefully for what is required. Not following instructions may result in disqualification or lower placement.
4. One entry per exhibitor in each section and it must be recent work of the exhibitor.
5. Spelling and neatness counts on all entries.
6. Baking must be on a sturdy paper or plastic plate in a clear plastic bag, or covered in plastic wrap. Please, **no glass plates**. Do not staple wrap to the plate.
7. **Note:** The work should be the world of the child.

AGE 4 AND UNDER AS OF JUNE 30th of current year - Print age on front of entry tag

Theme: “Promoting Orangeville Fair”

Poster: must be hand drawn not computer generated

Minimum size 22cm x 28 cm

Maximum size 28 cm x 44cm without border

1. Please label clearly on the back of your poster – Name of Fair, district #, contact person, owner of poster, complete mailing address must be clearly labeled on back of each entry, school grade (or “home school grade”), telephone number.

2. Each entry must be centered on card stock or Bristol board exposing a 5.5cm border on all four sides.

3. Entries will be judged on:

- Overall Appearance – 50 points
- Hand Drawn – 35 points
- OAAS Criteria (size, material, theme) – 15 points
