Rules:

1. Amateurs only. Please!
2. Place all heavy flowers in a weighted container.
3. All precautions will be taken to safeguard exhibitor's containers however; the Orangeville Agricultural Society cannot be responsible for any mishap. Please do not use expensive or heirloom containers.
4. Flowers must be grown by the exhibitors, except in the decorative arrangement class where additional materials may be purchased.
5. Decorative arrangements, unless otherwise stated, use fresh flowers only, adding foliage and accessories to carry out your version of these sections.
6. Biennials may be shown as perennials.
7. Rose blooms should be ½ to ¾ open at judging time.
8. NO flower arranging in the hall on the day of the fair.
9. The committee reserves the right to remove any wilted, or dead flowers.
10. Please ensure the entry tags are securely attached to the exhibit.
11. The condition of plant material, and artistic effect, of the design will be judged. Note – the container is part of the design.
12. The Judge's decision is final for awarding of the prizes.
13. **The Judging & Exhibiting Standards for Horticultural & Floral Design 2003**, will apply in all sections of Class 28. This booklet is available from the local horticultural society.
14. Another source for judging criteria is the **Agriculture & Horticulture Judging Standards for Ontario Fairs – revised 2013**.
Elements & Principals of Design used in the judging are explained in detail in the above-mentioned booklets.
Use of space, line, form, colour, texture, balance, rhythm, proportion, scale, contrast & dominance.

Hints:

1. *The Quality and variety of blooms and the artistic effect of the exhibit will be judged.*
2. *Also, consider chief points of design; harmony, distinction, & originality, suitability to the occasion, harmony and relation to the container. These are all considerations when judging.*

ANNUALS

1. Asters, 3 stems
2. Chrysanthemum, 2 sprays, any variety, any colour
3. Cosmos, 3 stems
4. Dahlia, 3 blooms, less than 5"
5. Dahlia, 3 blooms, more than 5"
6. Nasturtiums, 3 stems
7. Marigolds, 3 blooms less than 3"

8. Marigolds, 3 blooms more than 3"
9. Geranium, 3 blooms
10. Sunflower bouquet of 3-5 stems, with appropriate foliage
11. Petunias, 3 sprays
12. Snapdragons, 3 stems
13. Daisy, 3 blooms any type
14. Zinnias, 3 blooms, 2" or over
15. Zinnias, 3 blooms, 2" or under
16. Any begonia, 3 blooms
17. Begonia, tuberous, with foliage, floating in water 1 bloom (floating means not touching the sides or bottom of the container).
18. Any annual not included in Sections 1-17, 3 blooms

19. Sedum, 3 stems
20. Hosta leaves, 3
21. Hydrangea, 3 blooms
22. Phlox, 3 sprays
23. Rudbeckia, (black-eyed Susan) 1 stem
24. Any perennial not included in /sections 19-23, 3 stems
25. Rose, 1 stem, 1 bloom
26. Rose, 3 stems, 3 blooms
27. Rose, most fragrant
28. Rose, bi-colour, 1 bloom
29. Rose, miniature variety, 1 stem, 1 bloom
30. Rose of Sharon, 3 stems
