1. One gallon Barley
2. One gallon Canola
3. One gallon Clover Seed
4. One gallon Wheat
5. Six cobs of grain corn
6. Sheaf (6 stalks) of corn
7. Largest Sunflower (head only)

CLASS 23 – HAY

1. First cut, conditioned, 6" slice

2. First cut, unconditioned, 6" slice
3. First cut, chopped or loose, 1/2 bushel, in a plastic bag
4. Second cut, 6" slice or, 1/2 bushel
5. Haylage, 1/2 bushel

6SP: **LIVINGSTON FAMILY SPECIAL:** The exhibitor with the most points in sections 1-5. Prize: \$50

CLASS 24 – GARDEN VEGETABLES & ROOTS

Chairperson: Sheila Orton 519.938.8964

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1. Entry tags must be firmly attached on the items being exhibited.
2. Vegetables to be cleaned but not washed. A nylon stocking or soft cloth may be used for cleaning. Onions must be cleaned, but not peeled, except for jagged and dirty outer scales. Remove roots just below the bulb.
3. Except where noted, all vegetables are to be shown on a sturdy plastic or paper plate.
4. Please ensure that your entries match the description indicated beside each item i.e. quantity or sizing.
5. In cases of multiples, the judge is looking for uniformity of colour, shape and size and free of blemishes.
6. In the event of only one entry in a section, the judge has the power to withhold a 1st place award and, recommend it for only a 2nd or 3rd.

Prize: 1st: \$5; 2nd: \$4; 3rd: \$3; 4th: \$2

1. Cabbage, largest head
2. Cucumber, 5 pickling, 2"-4" long
3. Cucumber, 3 regular slicing, 6" length & over
4. Cucumber, 3 English, 6" length & over
5. Sweet peppers, 3, 1" stem
6. Carrots, 5 short, 2"-4" length, no visible side roots, 1" green top
7. Carrots, 5 long, over 4", no visible side roots, 1" green top
8. Beets, 5 table, 1" top
9. Squash, 1 Acorn pepper, short stem
10. Squash, 1 Butternut, short stem
11. Squash, 1 Buttercup, short stem
12. Squash, 1 any other variety, short stem
13. Tomatoes, 5 red or yellow, stems on
14. Tomato, 1 large, red or yellow, stem on
15. Tomato, 1 large green, stem on
16. Tomatoes, 10 Cherry, red or yellow, stems on
17. Leaf vegetables, 3 varieties in a container of water, i.e. bok choy, lettuce, kale etc.
18. Garlic, 3 bulbs, 1" top
19. Corn, 5 ears for table use, 1/3 of husk removed, from the top down
20. Onion, 3 yellow, 1" stem
21. Onions, 3 white, 1" stem
22. Onions, 3 red, 1" stem

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
