#### **B: CHEMO HAT- KNIT OR CROCHET**

Prize: 1<sup>st</sup> \$10; 2<sup>nd</sup> \$7; 3<sup>rd</sup> \$5

Chemo hats are different from other hats. They are not designed to be worn over hair, so they fit differently. They are in direct contact with a sensitive scalp, so they must be smooth and soft. Consider hats decorated with removable accents such as knitted flowers, ribbons or pins.

Materials: Do not choose lacy, openwork patterns. When choosing yarn, choose fibres that can be washed without special care or instructions. Soft acrylic yarns are a good choice.

#### **C: Incubator Quilt Challenge**

#### **Rules:**

1. This class is open to women's institutes, church groups, guilds/ clubs, community not-for-profit organizations etc.
2. No entry fee is required for this class and no passes will be issued in this class. Each group must preregister on or before August 15, 2015 with the Chairperson to ensure a space.
3. Each group should supply and display a 12" x 18" (30cm x 45cm) card naming their group.

#### **Guidelines for Display**

1. To be an original display that promotes your organization.
2. Each display will be given 42" (107cm) of space in width and the use of four shelf areas 12" (30cm) in depth.
3. We encourage participants in this class to display items that support the Fair Theme "**Homegrown & Handmade**"
